As the winter months are fast approaching, please remember that we will be spending recess time outside with temperatures 20 degrees or better, therefore it is vital that proper outdoor attire be worn to school (HATS, MITTENS/GLOVES, WARM JACKET, BOOTS, SNOW-PANTS). If your child does not have appropriate winter clothing they may not go outside for recess. Mr. Crankshaw and I have spent much time in the education of our students to keep all outdoor wear zipped up in book bags (this includes hats, mittens/gloves, scarves) in order to keep tidy order of each child's belongings.

STUDENT SAFETY

Everyone continues to work hard to be sure that GSES is a safe place for children. Your continued help is sincerely appreciated! A few more concerns need to be addressed:

When dropping students off on the Knox side of the building grounds (west side) please be sure that they are not left off in the road. A number of children exit their parent's vehicles in the road, which, of course, is not safe for them. Please drop them off on sidewalks or lawn side.

All visitors, regardless of purpose must first sign in at the main office, state their purpose for coming. The school secretary will contact staff for any reason through the office before allowing a visitor to a classroom or classroom area. A visitor's pass (or gold sticker) must be worn by any visitor, regardless of purpose or length of visit to the school.
